Mother's Day 2024 in Australia

The idea started in America when a woman called Anna Jarvis held a small memorial service for her own mother on 12 May 1907. Soon after, most places in America followed, and in 1914 the US president made the second Sunday in May a national holiday.

The first Mother's Day in Australia was held in 1910. This initial celebration was mostly limited to special church services. However by the 1920s, many Australians had started celebrating Mother's Day, for children to show appreciation for the sacrifices, achievements and efforts of all mothers and mother figures.

Despite changes in the dairy industry, this property remains part of a farmer owned co-operative, supplying Norco. Surprisingly when Jill asked, it

appeared that we are all strong supporters of our local brand.

This includes:

- cardboard
- newspaper (unless it is used to line your kitchen caddy)
- paper towel
- tissue
- teabags.

These changes mean that compost created from the contents of our green bins is nutrient rich and helps create healthy soil.

These changes are a directive from the <u>NSW Environment and Protection Authority</u>.










Matinee Shows: May 11th & 18th Saturday - 2:00PM Tugun Village Community Centre
