The NSW Government has invested \$723.3 million in health for the Tweed Valley delivering a new, state-of-theart hospital with more beds and increased healthcare services, along with interim upgrades at The Tweed Hospital. This is the largest regional capital health investment funded entirely by the NSW Government.
