The medals for the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games feature a piece of original iron from the Eiffel Tower of 1889. Designed to be distinguished by touch, they include engravings & braille.





MASCOT: THE PHRYGE

The Paralympic Phryge, inspired by the Phrygian cap, symbolises liberty and freedom. The mascot has a running blade and represents athletes with disabilities.

OPENING CEREMONY

For the first time, the Paralympic Opening Ceremony will be held outside of a stadium. Athletes will parade through the iconic Avenue des Champs-Elysees to Place de la Concorde. An expected 65,000 spectators will get to witness this historic moment, which highlights the host city's commitment to accessibility and inclusivity.


Our lunches at the Tavern after General Meetings are also continuing to be a social winner.

DON'T FORGET TO VOTE IN THE COUNCIL ELECTIONS - SATURDAY 14TH SEPTEMBER, with Pre-Poll voting to start a week earlier.

Watch for the upcoming inaugural Tweed Food Festival 'Savour the Tweed'-October 30th to November 3rd. The 5 day event will involve 26 chefs, many venues, and a wide variety of foods, showcasing local produce.

The First National Wattle Day was celebrated in Sydney, Melboune and Adelaide on 1st September 1910, with street decorations of wattle blossom, wearing sprigs of wattle, often sold for charity, and planting of wattle trees in school grounds. In 1913, wattle was officially included on the Commonwealth coat-of-arms, and in December of the same year, the first wattle blossom stamp was issued. In 1916, NSW changed to 1st August, to coincide with the time when wattle blooms profusely in Sydney.

The proclaimation of Wattle as the national floral emblem, was completed during the Bicentennial Year, on the First of September 1988. Confusion over the actual date a Wattle Day required a long-awaited agreement with every State and Territory in 1992, and was declared by Bill Hayden as 1st September, the First Day of Spring (although most wattle blooming has finished). More recently the whole month of September has become **Wattle Month**!
